For example, offer sessions from OPHEA and/or YRDSB Promote peer-to-peer leadership opportunities: - Support and educate student leaders to engage peers in activities that promote safe and healthy relationships Spread school-wide awareness: - Post ‘Healthy Sexuality’ and/or ‘Healthy Relationships’ messages around your school - Support student-lead creation of ‘Healthy Sexuality’ slogans - Promote Gay – Straight Alliances (G.S.A.) or Equity clubs	- Support a student voice that reflects the diversity of the student population - Actively and regularly promote this voice in a designated space where students can ask questions and have discussions with school staff - Advocate for programs and resources that support diversity and healthy relationships (e.g., clubs, intramural programs) - Encourage students to participate and showcase their creativity in the Ready, Set, Create contest - Advocate and support student inclusiveness and youth led and committees which allow students to contribute to decisions that affect student well-being - Provide support for students related to exploring sexual health and relationships	- Support staff and students collaboration to build a healthy and supportive environment that promotes and encourages self-esteem, self-efficacy and respect for others - Encourage students to contribute ideas and discuss topics with peers related to promoting positive body image, self-confidence and sexual health - Identify resources and supports available for students to discuss - Display available York Region Public Health posters. For example, ‘Is it time to put the brakes on your relationship?’ poster developed by York Region Public Health - Create a school policy with guidelines reflecting Caring and Safe Schools policies and	- Make sure processes are in place to establish partnerships and work with parents and community partners, like York Region Public Health, to provide information about teaching approaches and resources to support discussions related to human development and sexual health Parent resources: - Read It's Easier Than You Think, an excellent resource guiding parents and guardians in talking with your children about sexual health and wellbeing Planned Parenthood has excellent resources for parents with videos and tools to help discuss sexuality Alberta Health Services: Teaching Sexual Health provides parents with helpful information on how to talk to their kids and teens about sexual health Peel Public Health provides practical ways to discuss sexual health
